The train offers two different experiences, depending on the direction you're traveling. During the journey, you'll pass by the scenery of London and the British countryside. And based on your seat and angle, the journey will look different. Be sure to watch for Hagrid on a flying motorbike, the Weasley twins on brooms and the Knight Bus in London traffic.

Deep inside the mine where a million diamonds shine reside Snow White's famous friends, and the new **Seven Dwarfs Mine Train** brings them to life more realistically than ever before as part of New Fantasyland_® at the Magic Kingdom_® Park. The journey is accompanied by music and animated figures from the classic 1937 film.

The new attraction showcases a first-of-its kind coaster system that cruises up lifts, across banks and around turns through a glittering mine. From your mine car, you'll see the fully animated faces of the Dwarfs, whistling while they work with smooth, natural movements. They're being called "some of the most advanced Audio-Animatronics figures Walt Disney Imagineering has ever created."

The ride includes a "big drop" after exiting the interior mine area where you'll briefly be able to see a full view of the rest of New Fantasyland, including Beast's Castle and Prince Eric's Castle. The iconic Cinderella Castle will also be visible.

Also, paying homage to the magic and pageantry of Fantasyland and its inhabitants, the new Disney Festival of Fantasy Parade features innovative floats, vibrant costumes and original music winding through the streets of the Magic Kingdom Park each afternoon.

Share the excitement of the **50th anniversary celebration** that continues for the next eighteen months at all SeaWorld[®] parks, including Orlando. During the celebration, you'll discover even more up-close animal encounters—watch for a pair of Magellanic penguins, a lemur or even a parade of flamingos.

You'll also be invited to take part through new interactive experiences, shows and pathway performances, plus a "Surprise Squad" with prizes every day. Also included will be new ways for guests to connect to the parks and each other through digital devices.

Chill out

When visiting SeaWorld Orlando, don't miss the recently opened realm of **Antarctica: Empire of the Penguin™**. The "coldest theme park attraction in Orlando" combines 30-degree temperatures, up-close encounters with more than 250 penguins and a family adventure ride to create a thrilling, chilling experience.

And if you're visiting **Aquatica, SeaWorld's Waterpark™** next door, you can test your bravery at the new Ihu's Breakaway Falls. At nearly 80 feet tall, it offers four unique slide paths—three "breakaway boxes" where you watch each other fall one-by-one and a fourth open slide for a different, but just as exciting descent.



Feel the "Fury" at Busch Gardens®

If you like thrills, head to the west coast of Florida and check out the fearsome Falcon's Fury™ at **Busch Gardens Tampa**. The centerpiece of the new Pantopia™ land, it's the tallest freestanding drop tower in North America, standing at 335 feet. At the ride's highest point, like its bird-ofprey namesake, riders pivot 90 degrees in midair to a face-down dive position before plunging straight down at 60 mph.

A New Way to Go Coasta

When it comes to vacation variety, few places offer the diversity of Cocoa Beach, Cape Canaveral and the **Space Coast**. Located midway between Miami and Jacksonville and just over 50 miles east of Orlando, you'll fall in love with the area's charms—from swaying palms to sparkling beaches, rocket gardens to botanical gardens, space ships to cruise ships and much more.



Space and science to spare

Experience the world's most authentic space attraction firsthand at the **Kennedy Space Center Visitor Complex** in Cape Canaveral. This one-of-a-kind spaceport offers rich historical references in every exhibit, along with a clear vision into the future of space exploration and travel. It's all bolstered by fascinating learning opportunities from both the International Space Station and the Hubble telescope photos.





Meanwhile, the **Air Force Space and Missile History Center**, an extension of the Air Force Space and Missile Museum, is open to the general public six days a week. The History Center is located just outside the south gate of Cape Canaveral Air Force Station. Historic information and exhibits for each launch complex at Cape Canaveral Air Force Station are on display.

At the **Brevard Museum of History and Science**, you'll experience the diverse history of Brevard County through colorful dioramas depicting everything from woolly mammoths and saber-tooth cats to modern rockets and space shuttles. Visitors can handle fossils, specimens and artifacts from the animals and cultures that have lived in the area over many thousands of years.

Into the wild

The **Brevard Zoo** is a wonderful attraction and conservation hub where you can get closer to nature and be reminded of the diversity of life with which we share this planet. The zoo covers over 75 acres and offers many activities, including Treetop Trek, guided kayak tours, paddleboats, giraffe and lorikeet feeding, a rhino encounter and more.

Since ancient times, the barrier island of the Canaveral National Seashore has provided sanctuary to both people and wildlife. Many threatened animals find refuge there, including nesting sea turtles. Like Native Americans and other early settlers, you too can find tranquility as you swim in the ocean, fish in the lagoon or stroll down a wooded trail. Or simply reflect on the longest expanse of pristine shoreline in Florida.

The **Merritt Island National Wildlife Refuge**, which is an overlay of the John F. Kennedy Space Center, consists of 140,000 acres of brackish estuaries and marshes, coastal dunes, scrub oaks, pine forests, palm and oak hammocks. Many recreational opportunities are available, including bird and wildlife observation, a wildlife drive, a manatee observation deck, fishing and hunting opportunities, boating and paddling.







Catch a cruise

Port Canaveral is a popular place to hop aboard a threeto seven-day cruise to the Bahamas or the Caribbean. With four million cruise passengers each year, it's the second-busiest cruise port in the world and the home port for ships from Carnival Cruise Lines, Disney Cruise Line and Royal Caribbean International.

Even if you're not ready to board a ship, you can enjoy the sight of the luxurious liners leaving the docks in the afternoon. Head to the nearby beach or fishing pier at Jetty Park, or get a bird'seye view from the top-floor observation deck of the new Exploration Tower just a few blocks from the resort. The tower is also a great way to learn more about the rest of the area through exhibits and interactive experiences.

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New Duplo[®] Valley Toddler Area Opens at Legoland[®] Florida

New enhancements at **Legoland Florida** will bring the Lego® Duplo line of preschool building toys to life with farm-themed attractions, an air-conditioned indoor play area and outdoor water spot created for toddlers aged two to five. Duplo Valley will be the ideal place for park guests to play and relax with their children.

The Duplo Train lets toddlers and parents explore countryside-themed scenery while riding through farms, fishing holes and campgrounds. Just across the way, toddlers can ride a tractor just their size and help farmers plow their cornfields and hunt for missing farm animals.

Kids looking to cool off can make a big splash in the refreshingly fun water park with intermittent fountains

and interactive aquatic elements surrounded by farm animals that are larger than life.

The existing Duplo Barn will also feature significant enhancements, so families can play indoors together in the comfort of air conditioning. Existing attractions will be enhanced with additional Duplo farm-themed play areas along with a toddler room where parents can relax while kids enjoy Duplo bricks.



Have a Real Blast

Your dream to be like James Bond comes true at **Blast Off Adventures** in Clermont. Hop into the water and prepare to get launched as high as 30 feet in the air, propelled by a jet pack called JetLev. The device is part watercraft and part aircraft designed for safety, stability, ease of use and precise and effortless control. In as little as six minutes, almost anyone can take off, fly, turn, hover and land. "Flights" lasts 20–30 minutes, and you can also get a video of the experience for an additional charge.

Hang Out Over Central Florida

You don't need a mountain to hang glide. **Wallaby Ranch** in Orlando is the first and largest aerotow hang gliding flight park in the world, and it also has a reputation for being one of the best and safest places to learn. And you don't need a mountain to get launched. At Wallaby Ranch, gliders are towed aloft using a specially designed, ultra-light tow plane (an "aerotug" or "tug" for short).

For launch, the glider sits on a specially designed rolling cart and an assistant connects you and your glider to a 150-foot-long tow line. Then, at a signal from the ground crew, the tug accelerates. When you have enough airspeed (after a couple of seconds), you rise smoothly from the cart into the sky. It's equal parts thrill ride and family-friendly fun.



Give This Attraction **a Whirl**

WhirlyDome is home to Orlando's totally mechanized team sport: WhirlyBall. Think of WhirlyBall as a combination of bumper cars, basketball, Jai-alai and hockey. The game is played five-on-five, with players piloting WhirlyBugs (high-tech bumper cars) while using a scoop to pass and shoot a plastic ball at their opponent's goal. As players bump and block around the court, referees enforce rules, keep score and make sure everyone has fun.

WhirlyDome visitors can also experience the sights, sounds and adrenaline rush of driving a Formula One race car with the new Formula One racing simulator, modeled after the F1 simulators used by professional racing teams. There's also Lazer Frenzy, where players navigate through a maze of beams, fog and mirrors. And you can enjoy pool tables, a variety of arcade games and a casual pub offering specialty craft beers.



Swim with the Giants

The Florida manatee is a curious, friendly and playful animal. Ranging in size from 800 to more than 1,200 pounds, these slow-moving denizens of the sea make it hard not to fall in love. They prefer the warm waters of the Gulf of Mexico, but you'll also find herds grouped together in the 72-degree, spring-fed Crystal River, located only two hours from Orlando.

Whether you're on your own or visiting through a **Meet a Manatee** tour, you can interact with these graceful, docile creatures as they glide peacefully through their natural habitat. It's an experience you'll never forget.

A Trip Around Our Resorts

It's an action-packed summer lineup for Central Florida, and things are heating up at our other resort locations too! Here are some great ideas to add some extra fun to your season.

If music is your thing, you have multiple choices. Lake Geneva is home to free **Concerts in the Park** every Thursday night in July and August. Or chill out at Saengerfest Park in Galveston at **Music Night on The Strand** every second and fourth Saturday. Enjoy a series of Thursday night **Concerts in the Park** in Vermont.

Fourth of July celebrations will be everywhere, and few will be as grand as **July 4th Fireworks on Marco Beach**, with plenty of beachside activities to enjoy as well. To cool down in Williamsburg, try renting paddleboards at **Eco Discovery Park** or boating at **The Mariners' Museum**, now open for family adventures on weekends throughout the summer. Visitors to Las Vegas get the first rides this summer on the 550-foot-tall **High Roller**, the world's largest observation wheel and the focal point of a new \$550 million **LINQ** entertainment district. Gatlinburg guests will tap their toes to **Smoky Mountain Tunes & Tales**, a summer-long street event featuring costumed musical performers, storytellers and artisans.

As the summer winds down, don't miss the eighth annual **Beach, Boogie & BBQ Festival**, a threeday celebration of delicious barbeque, free live entertainment and family fun from August 30 through September 1. And Panama City Beach rocks with the **Pepsi® Gulf Coast Jam**, another three-day Labor Day weekend celebration featuring sun, fun and country music.





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
